I am going to take some time to fill you in on what is ahead as we look to prepare for our 2016 Charge Conference. The Charge Conference is the once a year meeting where we celebrate our past and set leadership, budgets and goals for the coming year. It has also become a time when we gather with other United Methodist Congregations in our area and share in worship with one another. So plan now to join us on Sunday, November 13 at 4:00 pm at Ellijay First UMC. Between now and then we have a multitude of task to complete to prepare for that meeting.

One of the big areas covered this time of year is the election of leaders for the coming year, done by the Lay Leadership Committee. This group, made up of Sara Fowler, Ronald Ledford, Rhonda Hunt, Dianne Traynham, Jean Norman, Homer Key, Don Russell, George Utiss, Randy Tudor (Lay member to annual conference), Scott Jackson (Lay Leader) and me (Chair), will meet Sept.11, 25 and Oct. 9, 23 at 7:00 pm to prepare a slate of leaders for 2017. With prayerful consideration suggestions will be made for the coming year. I ask you to be in prayer as well. Phone calls will be made and you may be asked to serve Christ in and through the ministry here at JUMC.

Another area that is covered in the fall is our financial gifts. The Finance Committee will receive budget requests now through Oct. 14th. These can be emailed to the church Treasurer, <code>sgehring@jasperumc.org</code> or you can drop your request by the church office. The Finance Committee will hold an additional meeting on Monday, Oct. 17th at 7:00 pm to review the requests and compile the recommended 2017 budget. In conjunction with this we will also share together in our Stewardship Journey during the month of October. This will be when each of us is asked to make our stewardship commitment for 2017. Please know that this is more important for us as individuals than for the church. We make this commitment to set a goal for ourselves as a follower of Christ. The Finance committee does use the estimate of giving to gauge how we will do and if any adjustments are needed to our 2017 budget, but more important than that is our desire to fulfill our membership vow to be loyal in Christ in and through the ministries of the United Methodist Church and uphold it by our prayers, our presence, our gifts, our service and our witness. I invite you to join me as we continue to strive to be a follower of Christ.

After the work of the Lay Leadership and Finance Committees are complete, the Church Council will have a meeting on Oct. 25 at 7:00 pm to affirm this work. The Church Council is the decision making body of the church and all we do is approved by this committee before it is put into place. This meeting on Oct. 25 will be where any questions not covered before can be asked and changes will be made before final approval. Be in prayer for this committee as well so that we follow the vision that God has for JUMC.

The other important committee that will be meeting this fall is the Staff Parish Relations committee, which oversees and cares for our staff. We will be meeting in September to prepare their recommendations for staff salaries and benefits. In October we will meet to perform my pastor's review. Both of these meetings are important and your prayers are needed and appreciated. Your SPR does a great job to show God's love and grace to your staff. I want to leave you this month with suggestions as we head into this administrative time of year. First, pray for this your church, the committees, the plans, the staff and congregation. Second, seek where God is calling you to participate. Consider stepping out of your comfort zone and allow God to stretch your faith and your abilities. Third, continue to see financial giving as an important part of your faithful lives. Fourth and finally, as you plan for 2017 seek a small group opportunity to take advantage of and allow God to grow your understanding of faith.



Our present organ was given in 1998 and parts are no longer available for it due to the company no longer being in business.

Today, Allen Organ is the world's largest builder of church



organs and the world's largest builder of pipe organ consoles. Our new digital pipe organ will include sampled sounds from some of the best pipe organs from around the world. The organ also includes Genisys for long term sustainability as musical trends change and as technology advances. Our hope is that this instrument has whet your appetite for things to come.
