

Dear Church,

JUMC has two mission teams leaving the U.S. soon! They need your prayers. Our JUMC college student mission team of Holden Jackson, India Gleason, Gregory Meadows and Sarah Zambo along with Gerry Gleason and Nato Singletary are heading to the Dominican Republic from May 14-20. They will be working with two different full-time missionaries in the D.R. but in vastly different settings starting in Boca Chica about 20 minutes from the national capital of Santa Domingo on the southern shore. This is the first international mission trip for most of the team. Please **pray** that this trip will bring a life of living out the Great Commission and will build a new mission bridge for JUMC students and young adults.



Chris and Abby Tanton are missionaries from North Georgia working with Holt's House of Hope, part of the Holt Rowland Foundation out of Blackshear, GA. Holt's House of Hope motto is Refuge, Restoration and Hope. It is a place in Boca Chica that serves young men in the community ages 11 to 18 who can come 3 times each week to be invested in by our staff, receive a hot meal, and experience community with other boys. Our team will assist Chris and Abby in the evening Bible Study with the boys and during the day a variety of different needs around the House from clean water, to gardening to finishing touches on the new shelter for the boys and hopefully some baseball, the national sport of the Dominican Republic.

Our mission team will also work with Craig and Joanna McClure. Craig grew up in Hiawassee, GA and Joanna is M.K. a missionary kid who grew up in the mission fields of Mexico. The vision of the McClure's ministry is to glorify Christ Jesus through Kingdom expansion, accomplished through equipping others to fulfill the Great Commission by reaching their own people and multiplying biblical churches among them by equipping every disciple to be a disciple maker. They are currently engaged in some form of ministry in several small Dominican villages, including Bible studies, church planting, baseball ministry, basketball ministry, medical outreach, as well as food and purified water distribution facilitated through the local church plants. Craig has plans for our mission team to provide concrete floors for families in village of San Jose.



Then, from June 19-30 Mark Jamieson, Jean Norman, Scott Jackson and Dex Phillips will travel to **Obaga, Kenya** to follow up on the Jewels, their garden, the Hall and the Kids of the Kingdom Obaga, school lunch program. They will build a house, feed the kids and see all that God is doing in Kenya. In cooperation with Kenyan Nationals, JUMC will sponsor a 2 day free medical clinic and prayer tent, treating both the physical and the spiritual needs. In past years we have seen hundreds receive help. The garden has been expanded, the Jewel's Hall has electricity, the ladies are working with business loans. So much is happening.



Please **pray** for both teams and members individually. **Pray** for reparations on both sides, funds, travels, safety all the way, health, wisdom in interacting with the other cultures that our witness may shine brightly. If you would like to help financially you can give electronically through the church website or make checks to JUMC marked for either D.R. or Kenya mission, indicating an individual if you'd like.
