As seen from the Meadows. . .

I do not know about you but I am still having trouble writing 2019 on checks and forms. Regardless of that, it is still February 2019 and that is hard to believe. 2019 has a couple of big events in my life to share with you and I need to share some information concerning pastoral care.

Two events in 1989 would change my life going forward. In March of 1989 I was hired to be the Associate Pastor/ Minister to Youth at Sam Jones Memorial First United Methodist Church in Cartersville, Georgia. This began a career that I will celebrate 30 years of growth, joy and blessings with so many folk with whom I have been blessed to share life. March 2019 marks 30 years of ministry as a pastor in the United Methodist Church. I am both humbled and in awe that I could have been used in such a way for so long and I pray I can continue to serve to the best of my abilities moving forward. The other event of August 1989 that has made the first event mean so much more took place on Saturday, August 5, 1989 at 6:00pm at Tarrytown Baptist Church in Tarrytown, Georgia. The most amazing young lady showed up and allowed this young man the honor to be her husband. My 30 years in ministry are much better because of my 30 years of marriage to Lydia! Words all fall short when trying to explain how I feel about my wife and best friend. She has known me at my best and my worst and she still finds a way to forgive and love me. Loving her has truly taught me more about God's love. Therefore, 2019 is a big year in my life as I give thanks to God for both a wonderful 30 years marriage to the woman of my dreams and 30 years of ministry with the people I love called United Methodist.

I had a conversation this week concerning my view and understanding of pastoral care. I was informed that I needed to share these thoughts with the congregation of JUMC, so I am going to try to share some thoughts as best I can. Here at JUMC, we have on staff a Director of Congregational Care (DCC). This position assist the Lead Pastor in the area of pastoral care. Most of the time, the DCC will be the first contact concerning a need. The DCC will be the one making regular contact to home bound, long-term hospital and rehab church members. Contact will be done by phone, text, email or visits. The DCC keeps the Lead Pastor informed of these members and those who have asked for or inferred they need a contact from the Lead Pastor. The DCC is an extension of the Lead Pastor's office. Other ministry staff will also check and inform the DCC and Lead Pastor concerning pastoral care needs of the congregation. As for our Prayer list in the bulletin and the congregation concerns on our board in the office, I feel a person needs to give their permission to be placed on either of these lists. This is an attempt to care of a person's privacy. Many folks want to be on the prayer list, but some would rather not. As Lead Pastor, I always assume you would rather not be on the list unless I or the other staff are told otherwise. Please do not ever assume someone else will call the church office or that a staff member knows. Always contact someone connected to the staff if you want the DCC and the Lead Pastor to know about a need in your life. My cell phone number and email can be found in multiple places. Another thought is that for those on the prayer list and the board in the office, you as a member of the church, can reach out to those you know and show care and concern as a member of the ministry here at JUMC. One last thing to share, if you feel you are not hearing from me, your Lead Pastor enough, contact me. Call me, text me, email me, tell the DCC when he contacts you and say, "Greg, I would like to see you". Do not assume I know. My cell phone is always on to receive phone calls day and night. Around 10:00pm, I do silent the text and email notifications. Emergencies are handled the best way we can with what is going on at the time.

That is a lot to take in here in this second month of 2019. I am glad to talk with anyone about any and all that I have shared in this newsletter. My door is always open. As I close, I want you to know it is an honor and privilege to serve as your pastor and my family thanks you for your love and prayers. There is much yet to come in 2019 and if we remain focused on God and seek His path, we will experience His transforming love and grace.
