With July 1, 2022, we end our seventh and start our eighth year together. What a blessing for Lydia and me and pray for many of you as well. This month I want to share some thoughts concerning our North Georgia Annual Conference and a thank you to the wonderful clergy who will fill the pulpit each Sunday during my time away. As always, please spend time with all the information found here in the newsletter.

By now, I am sure many have seen an article in the Atlanta Journal concerning seventy United Methodist Churches disaffiliating from the North Georgia Conference of the United Methodist Church. I have had a few folks asking questions concerning this event and I do not have room here to go into it all but I want to share some thoughts and my plans for JUMC moving forward. Many of you may remember in 2019 there was a called General Conference of the United Methodist Church (UMC). This was to vote on a way forward about the divide within the denomination concerning human sexuality. Since that time, the divide has grown largely due to the cancelation of our scheduled 2020 General Conference and the replacement General Conferences hoped for in 2021 and 2022, all postponed and canceled due to covid-19. As it is now, our next scheduled General Conference will be 2024. Side note, General Conference is a meeting of United Methodist representatives both lay and clergy from around the world. Therefore, there are clergy and churches who have grown weary waiting and have chosen to leave the denomination. Some will align with the newly forming Goble Methodist Church (GMC), other denominations and others will remain independent churches. In many of the churches, as you can imagine, the conversation and the vote to disaffiliate has caused issues and in some cases placed even family members on opposite sides of the issue. As your pastor, I have had many one-on-one conversations about these things from 2019 until now and I am happy to have more just set an appointment and let us talk. Concerning a church wide conversation, I will be meeting with our executive committee Church Council Chair, Trustee Chair, Staff Parish Relations Chair, Finance Chair, Lay Leader and Lay Member to Annual Conference in August. The executive committee will then bring information to the Church Council. The Church Council will discuss options and then bring before the congregation the options they feel are the best at this time. I know this is a lot of information and for some you are seeing this for the first time. It probably will not matter to many of you but personally, I will remain a United Methodist Pastor. I have come to be at peace with the fact that is where God is leading me. I will still lead the congregation to make the decision you all feel the most at peace with moving forward. I ask that everyone be in prayer for God's peace.

I also invite you to reach out to me for conversation, after July 23rd please, as I will be taking some time off this summer. If for some reason you missed reading last month, I will be taking time off June 26th-July23rd. During that time, you will be blessed with four wonderful preachers on Sunday morning. Sunday, June 26, Rev. David Jones will share the sermon at 9:00 am and 11:00 am, Sunday, July 3rd, Rev. Thom Shores will share in our one Patriotic Service at 11:00 am, Sunday, July 10th, Rev. Blair Boyd Zant will share the sermon at the 9:00 am and 11:00 am services and then on Sunday, July 17th, Rev. Jane Brooks will share the sermon at the 9:00 am and 11:00 am services. You will not want to miss the blessing of worship with any of these amazing preachers. I am very thankful for their willingness to share this time with you on Sunday morning.

As summer time begins, remember your staff will be taking time off to spend with their families and they do deserve a rest and vacation. I remind you of this to say please consider calling the office to make sure the person you need to meet with is there or better yet set up an appointment with the staff person with whom you wish to speak. I pray your summer is blessed with many good and sunny days!

Curriculum

- Our preschool will use the Georgia Early Learning and Development Standards (GELDS) to provide a well-rounded and developmentally appropriate curriculum in all of our classrooms. We will also use a DECAL (Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning) approved curriculum in our Pre-K classrooms.
- Additional activities offered include Bible stories and activities, music, Spanish, Children's Moment with Pastor Greg, sign language, and STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) activities. Sign language will be taught to the 18-24 months and two year olds during circle time each week.
 - Children's Moment with Pastor Greg will take place once a week with the three and four year olds
 - Basic Spanish lessons will be taught to our Pre-K classes.
 - Music is an integral part of our preschool pro gram. Teachers use music daily in circle time and throughout the day. In addition to this, a music class will be offered once a week to all classes.

Report of the North Georgia United Methodist Church 2022 Annual Conference

On Wednesday, June 1, I arrived in Athens, Georgia for the 2022 three-day session of Annual Conference. I am always excited and honored to represent Jasper UMC anywhere I go but this year I was even more thrilled after two years of virtual meetings. Our theme was "A Place for You at the Table". I was eager to find "my place" and gather with Methodists from all over our North Georgia Conference in fellowship, worship and business.

Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson preached our opening Worship service and the 156th session of the North Georgia Conference began. During opening worship, we celebrated the beautiful diversity of our church and came together in Holy Communion. We were also reminded how diverse we can be as we were taught to sing one song in three different languages as we experienced using "many tongues, singing with one voice".

Our business session introduced us to five areas of focus to guide our conference in coming years: Community Engagement; Scriptural Literacy and Imagination; Health and Wellbeing; Racial Justice and Healing; and New Faith Opportunities and Communities. Each of these areas was highlighted throughout the Conference.

As an order of business, the members of the North Georgia Annual Conference ratified the disaffiliation agreements of 70 churches, representing 9% of the congregations in the conference. Bishop Sue prayed a blessing on the departing congregations as she prayed: "We thank you for their faithful witness and ask that you will help us remain partners in ministry. We wish them well as they serve you in new ways".

Rev. Dr. Byron Thomas was endorsed as the North Georgia Conference episcopal nominee. Elections for Bishop will be held in November 2022 at the Southeastern Jurisdictional Conference.

Each conference session was opened in prayer from one of our attending Youth Delegates from all areas of the Conference. Many reports were given from the various boards and organizations within the Conference and the budget for 2023 was approved, proposing an additional reduction of 4%.

A celebration of recognition was held for the 29 pastors who are retiring this year and gratitude was offered for their faithful witness and service. A special worship service of Remembrance was held for those Clergy, Clergy spouses and Conference Laity we have lost this year. Rev. Jane Brooks offered the sermon, "Many Textures, Many Colors". The Service of Licensing, Commissioning and Ordination brought Annual Conference to an end with much celebration. Bishop Sue sent us forth with a reminder that "at Jesus' table, no one dines alone". She said "May it be so!"

Thank you, JUMC, for the opportunity to serve as your Church representative to Annual Conference. I am truly blessed to call you My Church Family.
