I am going to take some vacation during the month of July. I will be out of the pulpit on Sunday July 2 and 16. On Sunday, July 2 for our one service at 11:00am, Rev. George Freeman will be preaching. Here is a little information about George: "A life-long Methodist and native Georgian, George grew up in the Druid Hills/Emory section of ATL. Following service in the Air Force during Vietnam, he worked in the corporate world and was in lay leadership in the local church, District and NGA Conference levels. Then, at age 30, George received the Call to full-time ordained ministry. Following Seminary and eight Appointments, he retired from Jonesboro First UMC in 2017. George and Peggy moved to Canton and are now active in Hickory Flat UMC." On Sunday, July 16, Rev. Blair Zant will be here for both the 9:00am and 11:00am services. To help you know Blair: "Rev. Blair Boyd Zant is a pastor, preacher, wife, and mother, and Director of the Center for Congregational Excellence for the North Georgia Conference of the United Methodist Church. CCE exists to support, resource, and equip congregational leaders in making disciples for Christ, and witnessing transformation in the lives of individuals and communities. She specializes in leadership development, strategic vision planning, worship, and welcome. She loves to preach, but her favorite place is around the Communion Table. She is a proud graduate of the University of Georgia (Go Dawgs!) and Duke Divinity School (Go Blue Devils!). She has served Sardis UMC, Sandy Springs UMC, and Cannon UMC in Snellville, where she served as Co-Senior Pastor alongside her husband Rev. Will Zant. Will is now the Lead Pastor of Haygood Memorial UMC in Midtown Atlanta. In every season, Blair's work is meant to honor Christ, and promote true collaboration between congregants, between congregations, and between congregations and their communities. "I want everything I do to bring about Oneness: with Christ, with Others, and in Ministry to the World". I hope you will come and support my friends as they share with you this month.

This fall I want to share with you all *Questions Jesus Asked* (a six week study in the Gospels), by Rev. Magrey deVega. Here is the glimpse into the study. We all have questions for God, but growth happens when we turn things around and ask what Jesus wants to know about us. Why are you terrified? What do you live for? Who do you say that I am? In Questions Jesus Asked, author Magrey deVega explores six of the most provocative questions Jesus posed to others. When we dare to raise them, these questions bring us a fuller appreciation for the wisdom, power and presence of God in our lives. This study will be Sundays, September 10-October 22, 4:00pm-5:30pm and Wednesdays, September 13-October 25, 6:30pm-8:00pm. Both nights will be in room 106. The times could change but the dates will not. The cost for the book will be \$20.00. I have had the pleasure of hearing Magrey lead classes and preach, and I am sure this will be a great study and a chance to grow in our relationship with Jesus. Plan now to join me in September.




