### As seen from the Meadows...

Can it be February 2025 already? As we find ourselves here at the beginning of a new year, I have a one key item of interest to share this month. Please read and consider the needs of our church.

Not sure, you may know this but money is a hard subject to bring up in a church. Well, here in 2025, JUMC has to bring our financial situation to the forefront. Since 2020 we have cut our budget \$165,468. This has been needed due to the fact that we have not been meeting our budgeted expenses. Our 2025 budget is \$524,700; you can receive a copy of the full budget by reaching out to the church office. We will also have them available on the usher table in the back of the sanctuary. Our general giving funds our budget. General Giving is money given with no strings attached. General giving is what we give first. *Proverbs 3:9 Common English Bible* \*\*Honor the Lord with your wealthand with the first of all your crops.

In 2024 our general offering, the money that funds our budget, was 66% of all the money given to JUMC. Our budget is where salaries are paid. There have been months I waited a week later to be paid so the other staff members could be paid on time. Our budget makes sure the building has power, heat and air conditioning, so we are comfortable. Our budget funds our ministries to children, youth and adults. These budgets have been cut over the last few years as our general giving has gone down. Our budget pays our vendors that do work and provide services to maintain and upkeep our property and buildings. We have had to hold some of those checks until we had money in the bank to cover these expenses. We consider ourselves blessed that most of these vendors have understood and been gracious with us. Our budget also contains missional giving. We send \$6000/year to feed the schoolchildren in Obaga, Kenya and \$4000/year is donated to local nonprofits/ministries in Pickens County. This \$10,000 has been shared each month or quarter. Our missional giving through the United Methodist Church has not been sent on a regular basis. In 2024, we donated only one month to our United Methodist missional giving also known as our Apportionments. Over the last few years, this has been my heaviest burden to carry, as your pastor, for JUMC. The JUMC budget in 2024 was \$586,377. We received by donations \$428,401 for the general budget of the church. JUMC received an additional \$216,956 for restricted funds, book studies, retreats and other non-budget related items. Our restricted funds money are, as the name states, restricted. Many of our restricted funds do wonderful ministry, but restricted funds are understood as "Second Mile" giving. Second mile giving comes after our "First Crop" giving. Lydia and I give our "First Crop" giving at the beginning of the month. If JUMC shares that we need donations to help pay for a new HVAC unit then Lydia and I make a sacrifice and write another check, if we feel led. This is "Second Mile Giving". It means we make a sacrifice. Either we move money from savings or we give up something that month or for a few months to cover that "Second Mile Gift". The Meadows' "First Crop Gift" makes sure the JUMC can fulfill the general budget and meet the expenses laid out in that budget.

This is a good bit to take in and maybe more than many of you wanted to know. I thank those of you who are regular in your giving and you truly give your "First Crops Gift" to ensure JUMC's general budget is maintained. Together we can turn this around and be the financially stable church we were in 2015-2019. 2025 can be the year we make this happen, may God lead us on that path.


We launched our Midweek gathering this semester! It's a time to fellowship and grow together! Be here on Wednesdays from 4-5:30!

On December 2, 2024, eight men and two women from the North Illinois, East Ohio, West Ohio & North Georgia Conferences of the UMC responded to the ERT (Emergency Response Team) requests from the South Georgia Conference to do what we could. The path of Helene was more than 100 miles wide with continual lightning strikes & many tornadoes in addition to wind & rain. Camp Tygart in Ray City, a UMC camp housed us, giving us a place to sleep & cook our meals.

The people helped through the UMCOR (United Methodist Commission on Relief) ERT effort are those without insurance or are underinsured and those whose coverage doesn't include debris removal or limited coverage for direct damage for a covered structure. Our team worked for three days at five homes in Graham City clearing, limbing & cutting up trees. The ten team members traveled a combined thousands of miles with compassion, commitment & equipment to help in big & small way. The homeowners were either elderly or single parent homes.

Word traveled fast among the local patrons of who we were and why we were in Graham City (pop. 264) offering many thanks for our efforts. So, when your good fortune comes at the cost of another's misfortune, do something! Pay attention to the Spirit of Christ. Say yes, take one small step in faith & see where God leads. You won't be disappointed!
