The Wonder of Christmas

According to renown author David Jeremiah, "If you ask a typical American child below the age of eight what he or she would like to know the most about Christmas, he might say: "I wonder how Santa Claus can visit all the children in the world in one night. I wonder if reindeer really can fly. I wonder how Santa gets in the house when there isn't a chimney. I wonder how the elves make

all the toys for in time Christmas."

The sense of wonder most children have about Christmas is all tied up in Santa Claus. Though for those who do know about Jesus, they might wonder about a few other things like: "where did Jesus live before he came to live on earth? How could God become a baby? Why was Jesus born in a stable with animals instead of in a hospital? How can Jesus be a king if he doesn't have a crown?"

Those are good questions whether asked by a child or an adult. Those questions represent the sense of wonder that ought to resurface in our minds at this time of year and every Christmas. The first Christmas was certainly surrounded by wonder:

- · Mary wondered how it would be possible for a virgin to give birth to a baby (Luke 1:34).
- · Joseph wondered why he and Mary had been chosen by God to be the parents of the Messiah (Matt 1:18-25).
- The shepherds in the fields wondered about the angels that appeared in the sky and what their message meant.
- Mary wondered about everything that was happening at the birth of her baby.

Those are just the moments of wonder that are recorded for us in Scripture. But, think about how many more countless moments there must have been among the people of Nazareth and Judea who were witnesses to the first Christmas... They must have wondered what was going on in that little town of Bethlehem. Why wise men would travel so far to see the baby of a poor peasant man and woman?

What would you and I have thought if we had been living there when the first Christmas took place? This year take time to wonder and be astonished by God's gift to you. Read the Christmas story as found in Matthew Chapters 1 and 2 and in Luke 2. Consider how your life is different, or how it might be different if you really believed and lived out the Christmas story.

For unto you a child is born, to you a son is given, ...

And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.






Golden Bells of Atlanta Christmas Concert Jasper UMC Monday, December 15 7:30 pm
