Chocolate to Ashes to Love

February has always felt like an odd month to me. It's a mix of things that don't seem to belong together. We move from the lingering glow of Christmas into the gray stretch of winter, then suddenly we're surrounded by hearts, candy, and Valentine's cards—followed closely by Mardi Gras, Fat Tuesday, and Ash Wednesday.

Love, indulgence, ashes. Celebration, restraint, reflection. It's no wonder Lent can feel hard to get excited about.

For many, Lent begins with one last big celebration—as if we need a final indulgence before the sacrifices begin. And if Lent is mostly about what we are giving up, it can feel like something to endure rather than something to embrace. But what if we've been looking at Lent from the wrong angle? What if Lent is not about sacrifice first—but about love?

Lent reminds us that before we ever reached for God, God was already reaching for us. Long before we confess, repent, or “get things right,” God's grace is already at work—pursuing us, embracing us, loving us—not because of what we have done, but because of who God is.

That's why Lent is not about giving something up to earn God's approval or prove our worth. Lent is not a spiritual test we pass or fail. Lent is the season when we remember and retell the story of God's love.

We move from seeing love only as a baby in a manger to recognizing love as God-with-us—Jesus Christ, whose love went all the way to the cross. A love so deep that Christ was willing to suffer and die for us. And the primary response God asks of us in return is not perfection, but love.

When we fast, we are not punishing ourselves. We are saying to God, “I love You more than the things that usually satisfy me.” When we pray or deepen our prayer life, we are doing what lovers have always done—we make time for the one we love. The words don't have to be perfect. What matters is the willingness to show up.

Lent, especially in our Protestant tradition, is a season of discipline and reflection—not because God is distant, but because God is near. It prepares our hearts to receive the joy of Easter by grounding us again in Christ's sacrificial love.

And here is the good news that matters most to me: Lent reminds us that we are not defined by our sin, our failures, or our self-discipline. We are defined by God's love and grace. The ashes we receive do not mark us as condemned—they mark us as claimed.

So maybe this February, instead of seeing Lent as a gloomy season, we can see it for what it truly is: A season where love deepens. A season where faith becomes more intentional. A season that trains our hearts to love God—and love others—more fully. Lent is not the opposite of love. Lent is love in training.

My prayer is that Lenten season will not feel heavy or joyless, but honest and hope-filled—as journey of love that leads us all the way to resurrection.

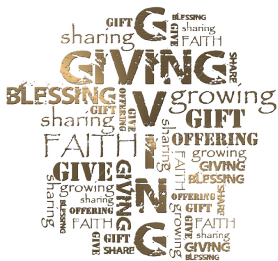
